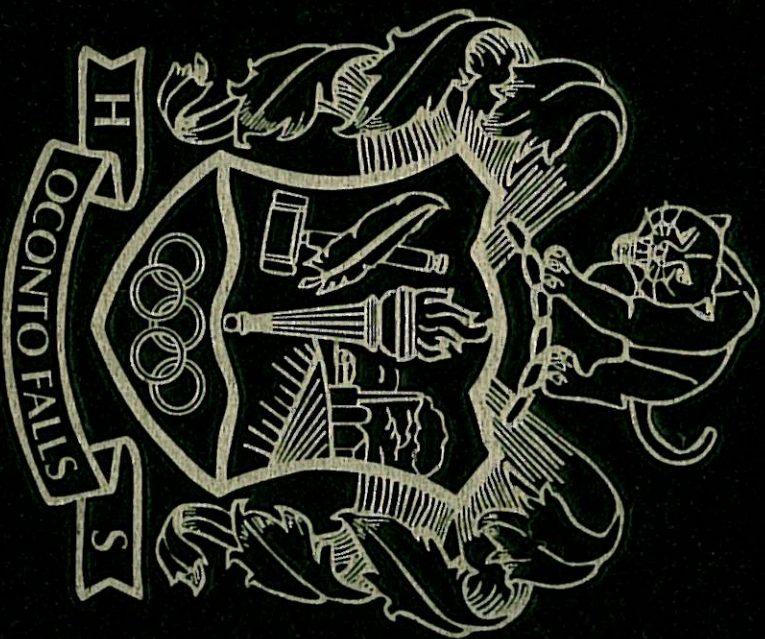

He attended the University of Wisconsin-Platteville and received a double major of Television Production and Television Advertising/Management in 1984.

Following graduation, Jim's career took him to Des Moines, Iowa, where he served as an Account Executive and was later promoted to National Sales Manager for KDSM-TV (FOX). In 1986, he was appointed to the position of Account Executive for the national television rep firm Settel, Inc., based in Saint Louis, Missouri. He was later promoted to sales manager for Settel in their Los Angeles, California, office. In 1989, Jim was named National Sales Manager for KING-TV (NBC) in Seattle, Washington. He was later promoted to Local Sales Manager for the station. In 1993, Jim was appointed to the position of Vice-President/General Manager for KSPY-TV (ABC) in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He was appointed to his current position as Vice-President/General Manager of WLUK-TV (FOX) in 1995. Jim is also a member of the Dolentown Rotary Club of Green Bay, Wisconsin.

Since his appointment to WLUK, he has systematically built a tenacious management team, the best in the market. WLUK has emerged from the status of television station also-ran to its emergence as the station in Northeast Wisconsin watched by more viewers than any market competitor.
